- Ready to get out of the house and attend a small event. Check out our events planned for this fall.


The Water Wonderland Quilt Challenge quilts are all turned in. Stay tuned for more information on voting and being able to see all these beautiful

**PINS!!!!** Please take extra care in checking your blankets for pins. We double check them, too, but we've had a few show up lately.

#### Packaging blankets for drop off:

When packaging blankets for drop off, please review these guidelines:

- Put them in a plastic bag preferably that can be tied at the top
- Put your name in the bag with the # of blankets included
- Put a piece of tape or note on the outside of the bag that says "Project Linus"
- New: Please do not use a STRAIGHT pin to attach anything to the bag or blanket
- New: Please do NOT use scented bags



Ever wanted to learn to make a quilt top or a scrappy quilt? Or do you just love to sew and make quilts? Grab a friend and join us for this outdoor event to make quilts! This event is for beginning sewers/quilters to advanced sewers and quilters. We will be outside in a covered pavilion with a bathroom and kitchen including a microwave and fridge so feel free to bring your lunch and/or drinks.

Karen Feltner will be our host. She will help us in making quilts using scrappy fabric squares. We will have donated squares in several sizes for making crumb quilts. We will have pattern ideas available also. Bring a yard (or more) of a solid or blender fabric (optional), <u>your machine/sewing supplies and quiltmaking tools</u>. You can bring your own scraps to share also. There will be irons available or you can bring your own. Also, we will have some quilt kits for sale for you to take home with you. Crochet and Knit Blanket Fun

Let's make some blankets for children with a matching book. These will be given to children in traumatic situations near the holidays.

You make the blanket – the book is supplied.

Be creative -- match the colors of the book and/or incorporate a design (caterpillar, flower, "counting" theme, etc.) -- you decide!!!

Blankets should be 40" x 40" or larger designed for a child ~2-5 years old.

Put the word CATERPILLAR and your name and phone # on a card and stitch or safety pin to the blanket. Leave at a PL drop off location by November 15, 2021 to be entered in a drawing for prizes! We will attach the book to the blanket.
