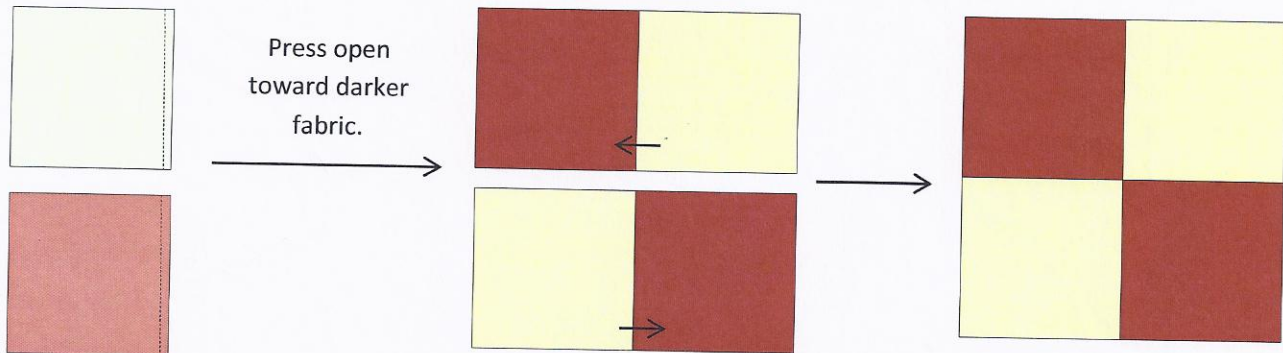
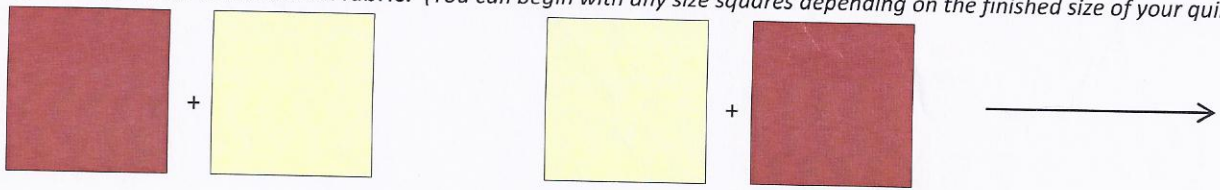
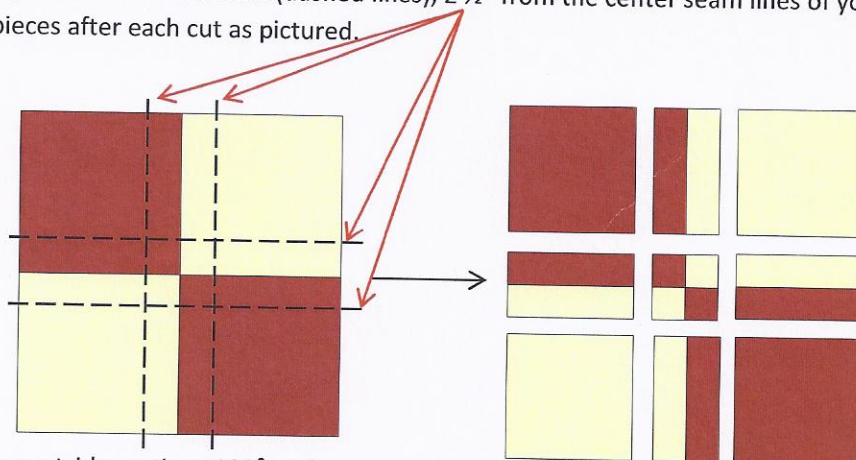


Disappearing Four-Patch Quilt

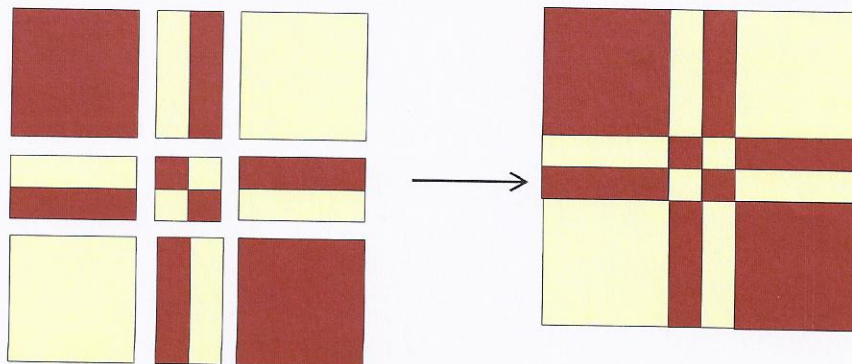
1. Begin with two contrasting fabrics and cut 12 – 10" squares from each fabric.
2. Create a four-patch block using two contrasting fabrics and sewing squares, right sides together with a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam as pictured. Press toward dark fabric. *(You can begin with any size squares depending on the finished size of your quilt.)*



3. Using a rotary cutter make four cuts (dashed lines), $2\frac{1}{2}$ " from the center seam lines of your 9-patch without moving the pieces after each cut as pictured.



4. Flip the center outside sections 180° and sew together with a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam & creating the Disappearing Four-Patch block.



5. Assemble 6 blocks (3 rows of 2 blocks) to create a 36" x 54" quilt top. Add a border if you like.
