

Project Linus Crocheted Fleece Squares

1. Cut squares in any size so that the finished blanket will meet Project Linus specifications.
2. Using the medium or large Skip-a-stitch cut holes 1/2 inch from edges.
3. Using a size G or H crochet hook, crochet edges. Single crochet in hole, chain one, single crochet in next hole. In corners single crochet, chain one, single crochet in hole closest to corner and continue.



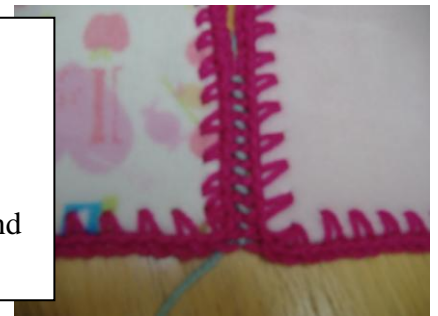
Three Techniques for Connecting Crocheted Fleece Squares.

If you can attach granny squares, you can attach fleece squares!



Technique #1- Whip Stitch

1. Hold fleece squares with right sides together.
2. Connect yarn to corner.
3. Whip stitch in back loops of each sc and in each chain. Weave in ends.



Technique # 2- Single Crochet

1. Hold wrong sides of squares together.
2. Crochet in back loops only.
Single crochet in corner, sc in each sc and in each chain space, to end.
3. Single crochet in corner. Weave in ends.

Technique #3- Single Crochet –Chain

1. Squares may be held right sides together or wrong sides together, whichever side you choose, do the entire blanket the same way!
2. Single crochet in corner of one square, chain one.
3. Single crochet in corner of opposite square, chain one.
4. Single crochet in chain one space, chain one.
5. Continue going back and forth from one square to the other until you reach opposite corner. Weave in ends.



To finish blanket, crochet around entire blanket with border of your choice.
