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What size should blankets be?

Suggestions for <u>approximate</u> blanket sizes are as follows: (in inches)

Preemie	Baby
18x18	36x36
30x30	36x40
36x36	36x42

Swaddling Blankets: ~36" x 50" (light

weight flannel works best)

Toddler through pre-teen: larger than baby up to 55x60 or even larger

Teen-size: about 2 yards long and 48" wide or larger

All blankets should be made of new washable fabric or yarn in child friendly colors.

Please no buttons, metallic fabric/ yarn or notes/names attached with straight pins, etc. All ribbons should be securely attached. Please double check blankets for straight pins and other unwanted items. LOCAL NEWSLETTER: Be sure to ask to receive the monthly newsletter. Let us know you want to be on the mailing list to receive it by U.S. Mail or email. You can sign-up on the website or email Deb.
